1. Central TV

They are offering a 3 minute platform to party leaders on what their policy has to offer the East Midlands, centred on Nottingham, at the next election. The interview would be done at No 10 by Jon Lander, ex-ITN and a friend. His aim would be to bring out what you wanted to say. They would like to record towards the end of July.

Recommendation

This is a useful platform for a small investment of research and interview time in an important area where the Labour Party is torn two ways - Militant v moderate and NUM v UDM.

2. BBC "Today"

On 3 January BBC started a Saturday edition of the "Today" programme and have asked to interview you live for it.

Recommendation

This is something you could do over the telephone, from Chequers for instance.

3. US TV Series

A freelance is producing a series called "couples" for American television and would like to interview you and Mr Thatcher.

Recommendation

Decline?

4. Tyne Tees Television

There is to be a new series of "Face the Press", using northern journalists. Transmission - on Sundays - will be confined to the Tyne Tees, Grampian and Border ITV areas. An interview has been requested on any Sunday between 8 February and 29 March.

Recommendation

We are not particularly enthusiastic.

5. CBS News

The programme "60 Minutes" is researching a story on "loony left" councils and would like to interview you.

Recommendation

We recommend against. Pass to Mr Tebbit?

6. NBC News

Gloria Steinem, producer of the "Today" programme would like to interview you when she is in London in February.

Recommendation

Regrets?

7. "Woman"

Michael Freedland has asked to interview you for the magazine. He says similar approaches are being made to the leaders of the other Parties.

Recommendation

You gave "Woman" an interview on 23 June 1986. But as it is such an important audience, you may wish to discuss.

8. Channel 4

In October we turned down a request from Channel 4 for you to appear on a programme called "Years Ahead" which will examine the main policies of the three parties. They have renewed their request, pointing out that they have now arranged to interview Dr Owen in late February and Mr Kinnock in early March.

Recommendation

If the decision not to take part stands, do you wish to nominate a senior Minister?

9. Italian Television

RAI I, Italy's main TV channel, have asked for an interview to coincide with the Anglo-Italian bilateral.

Recommendation

You should give a 15 minute interview to RAI's London correspondent, Sandro Paternostro.

10. "Star" Newspaper

Tony Smith, political editor, has asked if there is any possibility in the next six months of you joining his editor and about half a dozen senior colleagues at the St James' Club for lunch.

Recommendation

The Star has come round much more to your way of thinking, though not reliably, since David Stevens took on the Express Group. You got a lot of good publicity out of their award luncheon. It would be helpful if you could accept.

11. Media Seminar

On 20 February the British Executive of the International Press Institute is running a whole-day seminar at Chatham House on "constraints on the media". The Chairman will be Robin Day. There will be panel sessions - on what the political parties plan for the media in their manifestos; the Lobby system; and the law and the media. There will also be the first public discussion between News International and the print unions. On behalf of the NPI, Colin Webb, Editor-in-Chief of PA, has invited you to join the participants (senior editors etc) for a drink before the informal lunch or for the lunch itself.

Recommendation

We recommend you decline.

12. Debate Magazine

This magazine, the official publication of the Oxford Union Society, has asked to interview you. The interview would reach a total student readership of about 25,000.
